The hospital at home scheme is an early discharge service which allows children to spend less time or no time in hospital or to avoid repeated visits to the hospital. The scheme caters for children who would normally be admitted for hospital nursing care rather than requiring the 24-hour availability of a doctor. During the child or young person's admission on the scheme, a nurse can make up to four visits daily and is available 24 hours a day by telephone. The child or young person remains under the care of the paediatric doctors and is allowed to return to the ward immediately if required. The remit of the service is presently being broadened to become a generic children's community nursing team including home nursing for palliative care.
