This would help to make the guideline consistent with NG61 'End of life care for infants, children and young people with life-limiting conditions: planning and management'.			
2	1	27	We ask that this list includes life-limiting and life-threatening conditions.			
3	2	3	We ask that NICE specifies that this could include infants, children and young people who have degenerative conditions, who are likely to lose skills and will need to be regularly reassessed.
