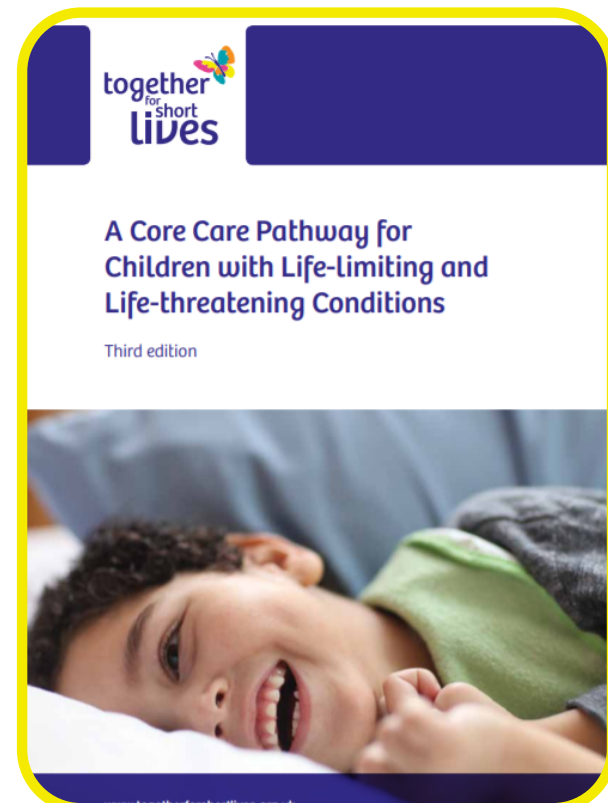
- **A Guide to Children's Palliative Care**

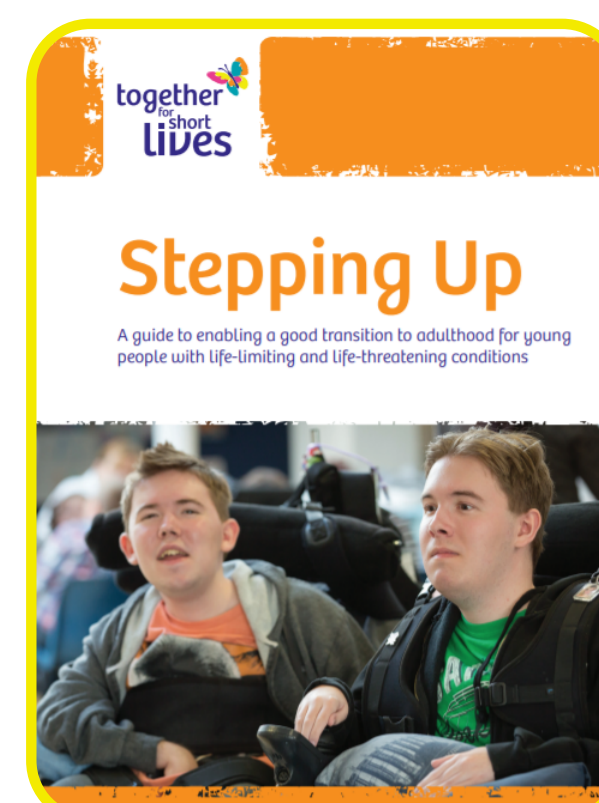
- **Perinatal Pathway for Babies with Palliative Care Needs**

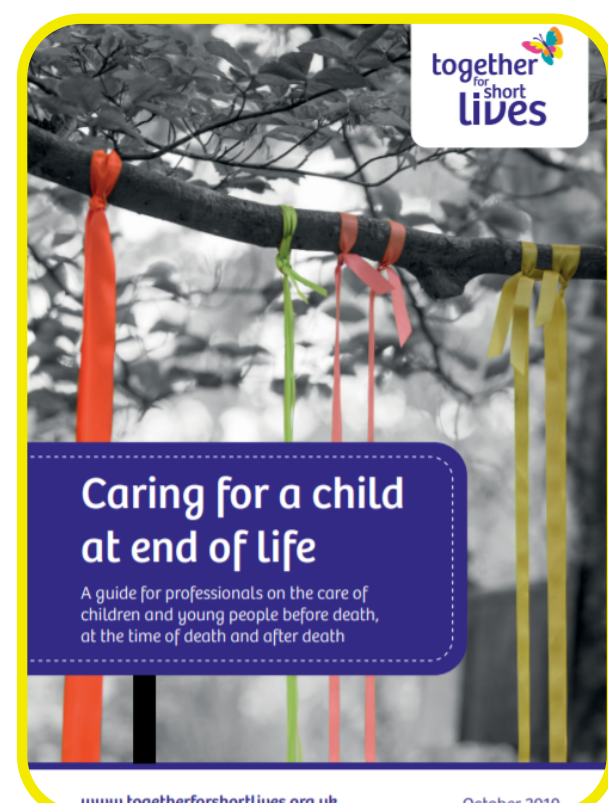
- **Core Care Pathway**

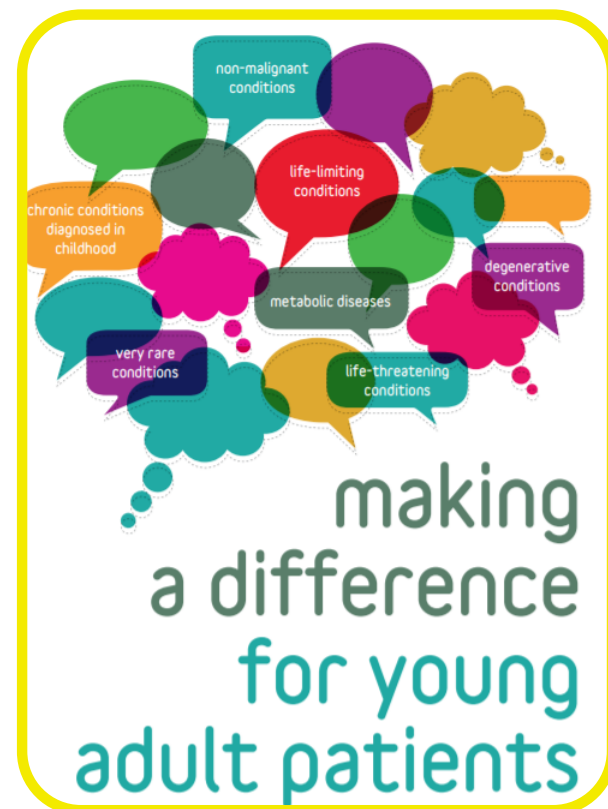
- **Caring for a child at end of life**

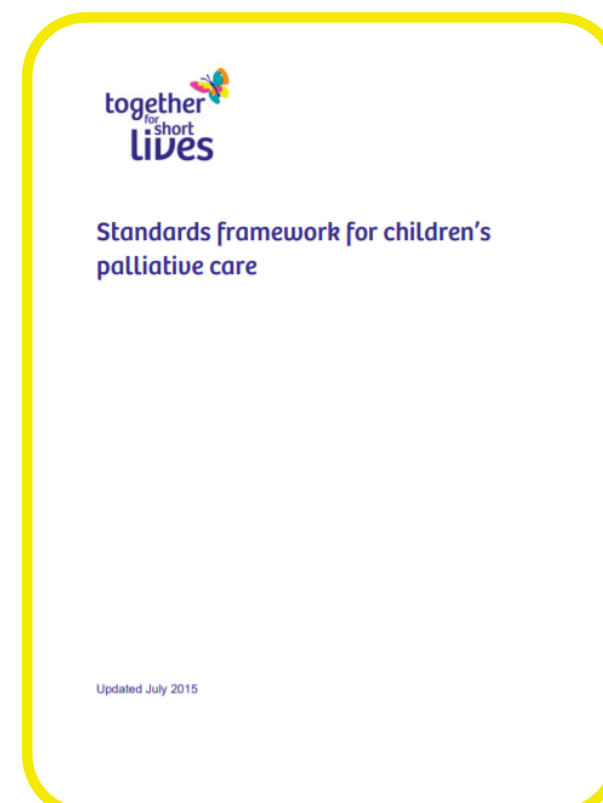
- **Basic Symptom Control in Paediatric Palliative Care**

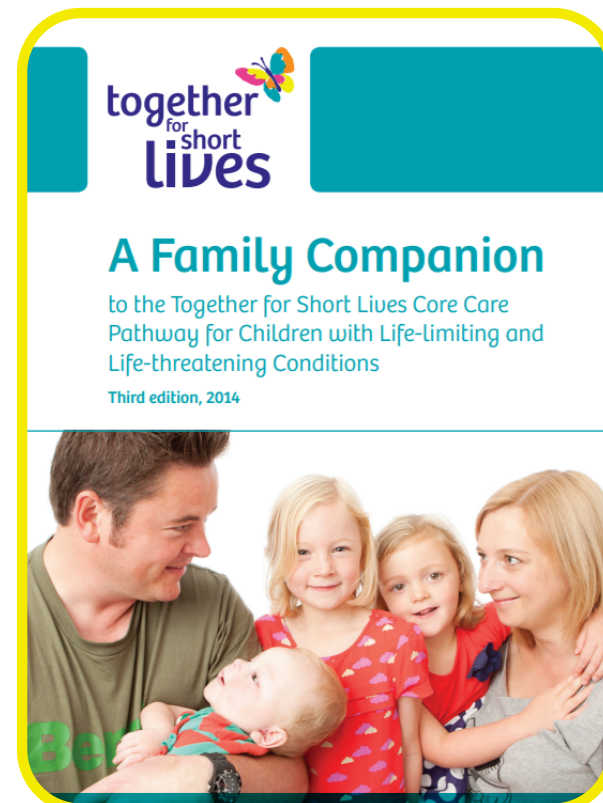
- **Developing volunteering services**

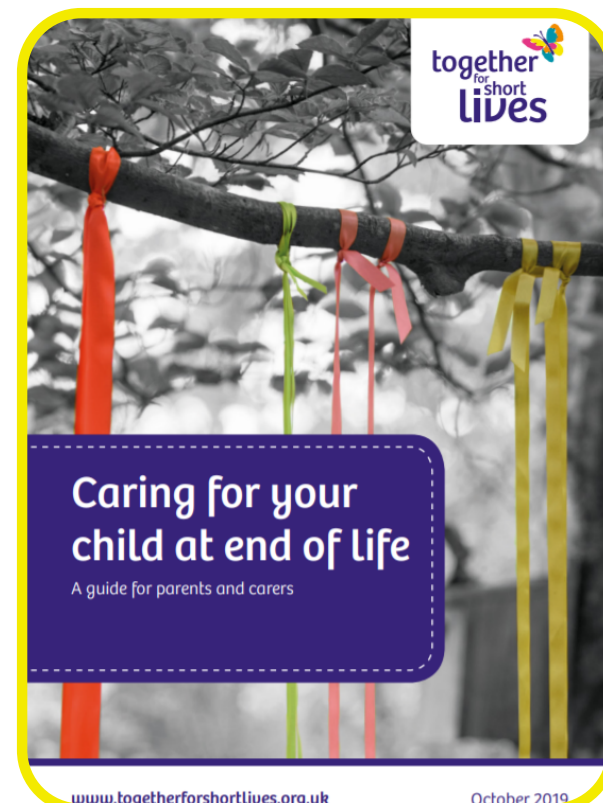

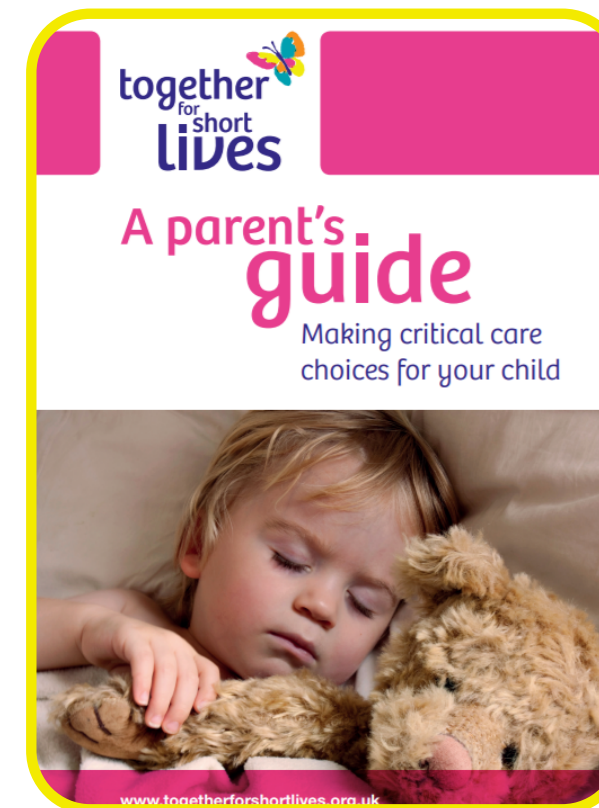


- **Caring for your child at end of life – family guide**

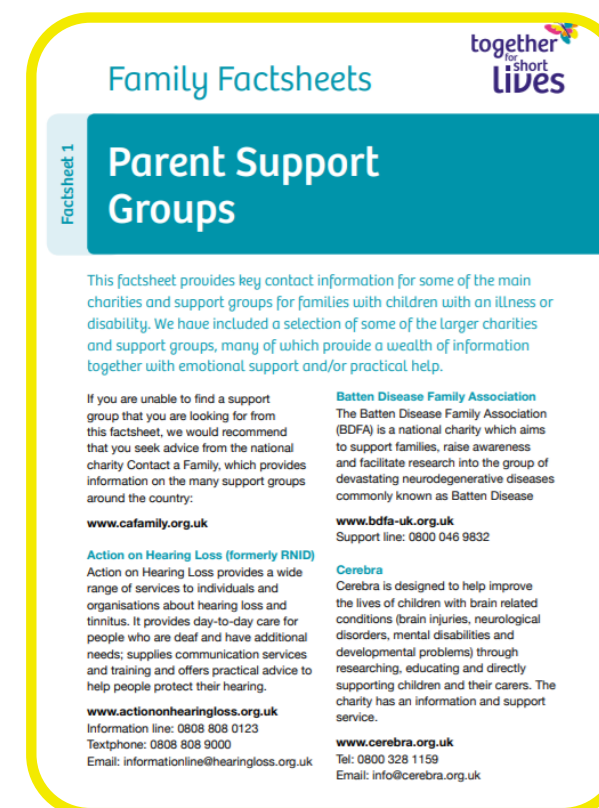

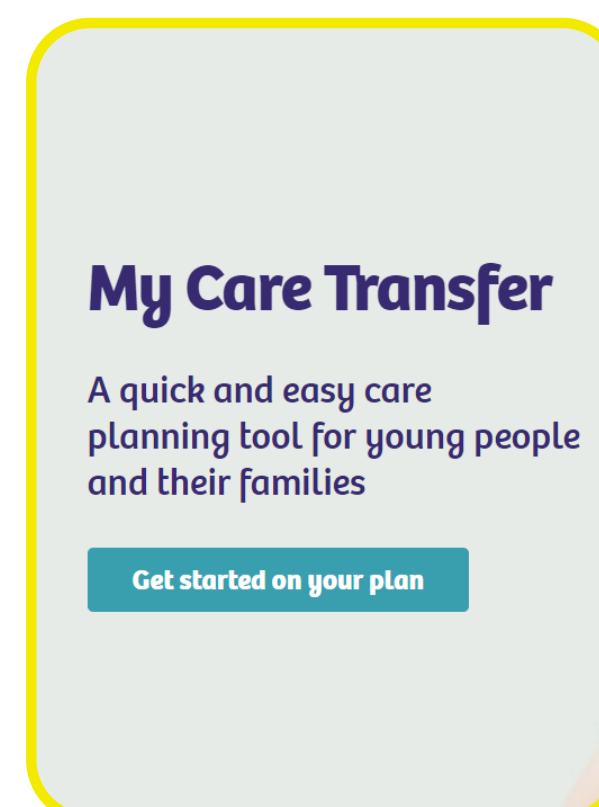
- **Making Critical Care Decisions for your Child**

Together for Short Lives has developed a series of factsheets to support families and provide information on a range of issues.



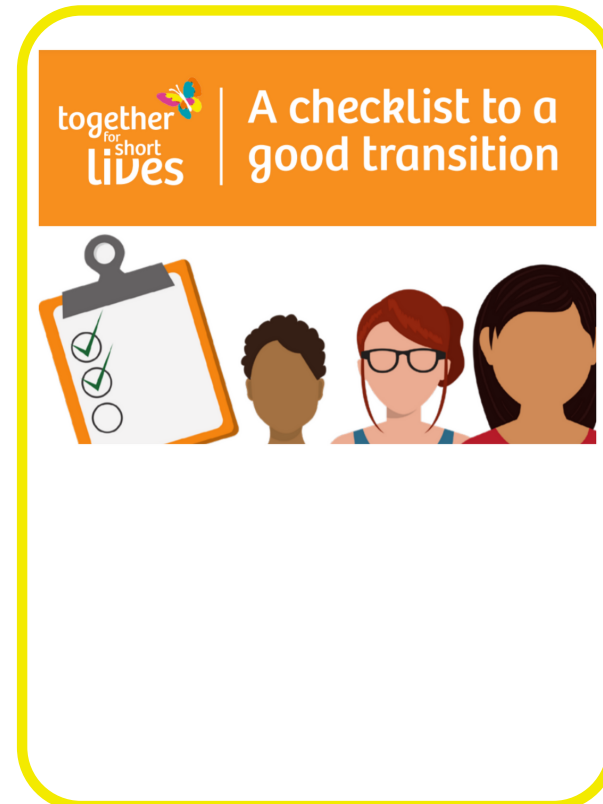
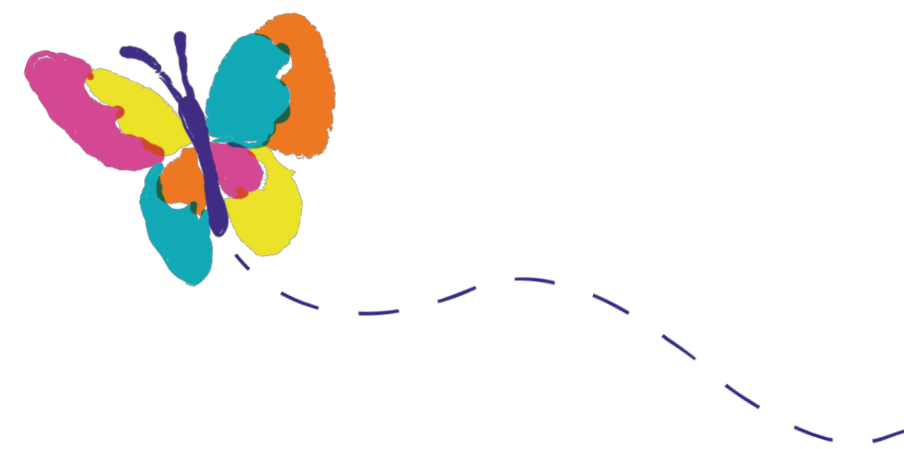
- **My Care Transfer**

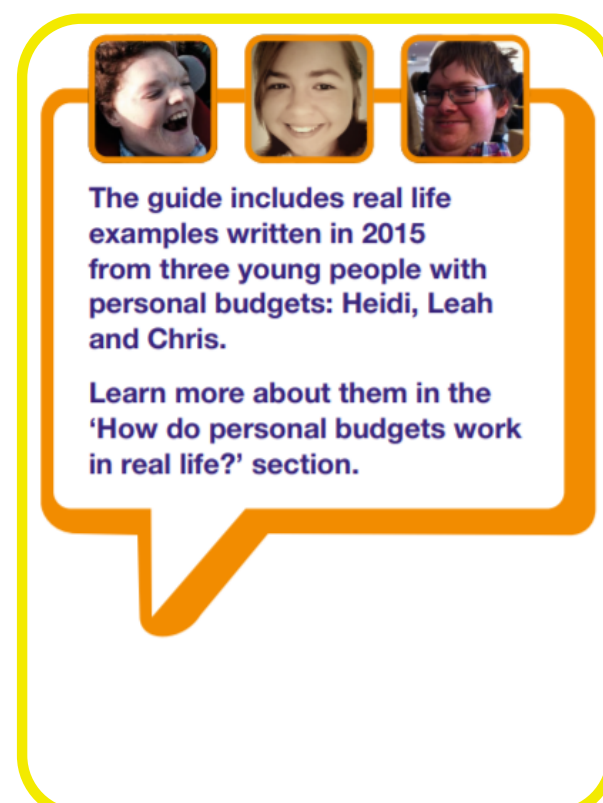
