Thank you for your request under the *Freedom of Information Act 2000* (the Act). This response is provided by North Central London Integrated Care Board (ICB). Your request along with the ICB's response is detailed below.

1. Please set out how much money your integrated care board spent on hospice care for children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions between 6 April 2022 and 5 April 2023. Please provide a total, in addition to a breakdown of funding per children's hospice organisation.

The number of individuals is 13, which is split between the organisations listed in Question 1.

Breakdown of individuals by organisation

NHS North Central London ICB does hold this information. The ICB considers that this information is exempt under *Freedom of Information Act 2000, Section 40(2) (personal information)* as disclosure of this level of detail could lead to the identification of individuals, which would be in breach of Data Protection legislation.

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 introduces a broader concept of risk of personal identifiable information because its test for deciding whether personal data can be disclosed is whether disclosure to a member of the public would breach the data protection principles. This means that public authorities have to assess whether releasing apparently anonymised data to a member of the public would breach the data protection principles.

This is intended to ensure that public authorities take into account the additional information that a member of the public might have that could allow data to be combined to produce information that relates to and identifies a particular individual - and that is therefore personal data. Low statistical values increase the likelihood of seemingly anonymised information being combined with other information to identify an individual.

The Hospice providers hold the information about the number of individuals receiving hospice care by their organisation. Please contact the providers listed in Question 1 directly.

3. Please set out how many children and young people with life-limiting or life-threatening conditions who live in your integrated care board footprint could benefit from children's hospice care.

NHS North Central London ICB does not hold this information.

The figures provided for Questions 1 and 2 above are mainly for Children and Young People that require end of life care and post bereavement support, which is commissioned on a spot purchase arrangement. There is some additional Hospice respite (short breaks) support commissioned by the ICB, Social care and directly by families using their continuing care direct payments.
